
EDUCATION

SAWAB firmly believes that education is paramount for national advancement. In Bangladesh, the 2023 Education Program by SAWAB provides vital support to vulnerable children, especially orphans, ensuring uninterrupted learning along with groceries and educational materials. With a focus on holistic well-being and educational excellence, SAWAB nurtures 25 parentless children in their Child Care and Development Center in Savar. Moreover, across multiple locations in Bangladesh, SAWAB supports the education of 322 orphan children by providing family food packs and educational materials annually until they complete their education.




HEALTHCARE & NUTRITION

Bangladesh's healthcare system contends with a critical doctor-patient ratio of 1:2800 and widespread inadequate access to medical services, especially in rural areas, further compounded by financial barriers hindering healthcare access. SAWAB's Healthcare Program plays a vital role in providing essential medical assistance to those in need. In 2023, the program reached out to 11,963 individuals, offering free medical treatment and essential medicines. 




SHELTER & NFI




WASH

In Bangladesh, where 60% of the population lacks access to safe drinking water, waterborne diseases and health issues are widespread (World Bank, 2021). Furthermore, nearly 80% of surface water sources are contaminated with fecal bacteria, posing severe risks to public health (UNICEF, 2020). SAWAB's WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) program is actively addressing these challenges by installing over 10,000 water wells nationwide, ensuring equitable access to safe drinking water and significantly improving health outcomes. Additionally, the initiative has established 9 water stations providing regular service to 900 families, 26 wudhu stations, 849 water wells, and 344 deep tube wells.




WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

In Bangladesh, around 61.5% of women are not engaged in income-generating activities (BBS Labor Force Survey 2019-2020), leading to economic dependency, limited decision-making, and social marginalization. SAWAB's Women's Empowerment program provides essential skills like sewing and handicraft training, empowering overcome poverty, participate women to decision-making, and contribute to community development. In 2023, 280 of underprivileged women benefited from the program, advancing towards a more equitable society. On the 28th of January, a crucial workshop on Family Management was held as part of these efforts.




CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION






POVERTY ALLEVIATION


With over 20% of the population living in poverty in Bangladesh in 2023 (World Bank, 2023), SAWAB's Livelihood and TUP initiatives stood tall as a source of hope. Bangladesh faces frequent natural challenges like floods and cyclones, with an average of 6-7 major cyclones annually (Bangladesh Meteorological Department). In response, SAWAB's Emergency Relief & Rehabilitation program swiftly addresses the urgent needs of affected communities.








SEASONAL PROGRAM




